

FIRE TRAINING

Staff are to be congratulated on the two assessed practice drills held in August during our recent Fire training

The first drill being the Code red drill was noted on the report as "the overall out come of the drill was outstanding" with a score of 9/10

The second evacuation drill with the Brigade in attendance was considered "outstanding "with a total score of 9.5/10

This was notable impressive as the drill was completed in an area that staff are not familiar in evacuating

Next years fire training has been confirmed for the :

- 24th March till the 26th March 2020
- 18th August till the 20th August 2020

FIRE ALARM ACTIVATIONS IN A CONSTRUCTION ZONE



A review between Meercroft and Quick fire of our latest fire alarm activation has resulted in some changes to our process in construction areas.

To ensure staff safety -staff are not to enter constructions zone

s for any purposes relating to emergency response.

For alarms that occur during Business Hours, Andrew Johnson or John Nichols should respond immediately to the fire panel to assist the search team and liaise with the Chief Warden. If the alarm is in a construction zone, then this person is to be briefed and respond immediately to that area to determine if there is a fire or not. The search team should follow to the last point before entering the construction zone.

For alarms that occur in construction zones outside business hours, staff should evacuate any residents that are either within the compartment attached to the construction zone or residents that occupy areas above the construction zone.

NEEDLE STICK INJURIES

Over the past few months there has been 3 reported needle stick injuries all using insulin needles.

As a consequence thereof, we are trialing retractable insulin needles. Registered nursing staff are reminded that the following procedures/protocol must be adhered to when

disposing of used medical sharps, to decrease the risk of injuries and possible transmission of blood-borne infections:

Small sharps container should be taken to the point of administration

and the syringe disposed of immediately, then the container should be secured back in the drug cupboard back in the relevant storage area

NEVER:

Re cap needles



Clip/bend or break syringes or needles Pass sharp objects directly between people Over fill sharps containers (to be filled 2/3 capacity only)

Force sharps in to container

ALWAYS:

Avoid distractions when handling sharps
Dispose of used sharp/s into container
IMMEDIATELY after use
Place sharp END of sharp into container first
Store ALL sharps containers in a locked
cupboard or room when not in use
Handle butterfly needles by the wings to prevent
the needle from flicking back
Leave needles or syringes of Intravenous or
Subcutaneous tubing and discard as a

FIRST AID KITS

It is a requirement under the WH&S Regulations / Chapter 3 / Division 3 / Item 42 that a person conducting a business or undertaking (PCBU) at a workplace must ensure:

- the provision of first aid equipment for the workplace, and
- that each worker at the workplace has access to the
 - equipment; and

COMPLETE unit.

 access to facilities for the administration of first aid. The official first aid station within the facility is Parkview Nurse Station.

It is a requirement that all accidents, incidents resulting in the requirement of first aid and actively related illnesses are to be **reported immediately** to the RN in-charge of Parkview who is responsible for administration of first aid and for completion of any association documentation.



Portable first aid kits are available in the following nurse stations: Parkview, Park Avenue, Seaview, Munnew Day Centre, Nursing Main kitchen and in all buses used by staff and residents
